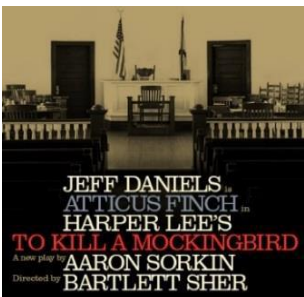

Stay 6 nights at the historic Warwick Hotel, built in 1926 by William Randolph Hearst for the love of his life, actress Marion Davies.

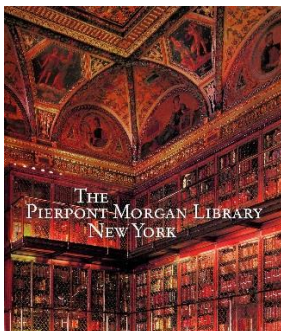

After descending from the Observation Deck, we'll enjoy lunch at the stylish **State Grill and Bar** on the first floor, featuring Art Deco artwork and classic American fare.



Learn about J. P. Morgan, one of the most colorful figures in New York's history at the opulent **Pierpont Morgan Library**, widely recognized as one of the finest treasure troves of priceless works from the realms of art, literature, music and history including the Gutenberg Bible, musical manuscripts of Mozart, Chopin and Brahms, a letter from Elizabeth I and more. It came into being in the 1890s as the private collection of the American banker John Pierpont Morgan.

Explore New York's newest gathering places....



Discover **Hudson Yards** - New York's newest development featuring unique public art spaces and innovative engineering and design concepts. Experience **the Vessel** created by Thomas Heatherwick, a monument meant to be climbed and explored. Comprised of 154 intricately interconnecting flights of stairs and 80 landings, the centerpiece will literally lift up the public. This larger-than-life art piece will be New York City's next public landmark.



Stroll through **The High Line**, a 1.45-mile-long elevated linear park, greenway and rail trail created on a former New York Central Railroad spur on the west side of Manhattan, featuring innovative public art and gardens. Explore the **Chelsea Market** and enjoy lunch and the view at the elegant new **RH Rooftop Restaurant** in the Meatpacking District. Complete the afternoon with a visit to the nearby **Whitney Museum of American Art**.
